Cynthia S. Mabry Otolaryngic Allergy Lectureship

The Cynthia Mabry Allergy Lectureship was established in 1999 to honor her memory (1937-1999). Cynthia was a long time active member of SOHN and well respected for her expertise in otolaryngic allergy. She successfully combined the difficult multiple roles of wife, mother, and nurse. As a certified Otorhinolaryngology & Head-Neck nurse, she served as an excellent role model for all colleagues. She was a dedicated otolaryngic allergy nurse who shared her expertise in many ways. She taught numerous allergy courses throughout the world. She was involved in the education of residents in the training program in Dallas. Cynthia lectured at both the national and local levels. She co-authored dozens of papers/articles and the textbook, ALLERGY IN ENT PRACTICE. Cynthia was the recipient of the Sam Sanders Award from the American Academy of Otolaryngic Allergy for research in immunotherapy for allergic fungal sinusitis. Cynthia exemplified the essence of the professional nurse who believed in a commitment to patient care and to our organization (SOHN) and served as President of the Dallas-Fort Worth Chapter.

Guidelines for Submission:

- 1. The presenter must be a SOHN member or sponsored by a SOHN member.
- 2. The presentation may be adult or pediatric oriented and must clearly include nursing implications.
- 3. The presentation should focus on at least one of the following (points awarded for each):
 - Allergy/immunology
 - Innovations in the management of the patient with allergies
 - Allergic rhinitis
 - Otolaryngic allergy assessment/management
 - Allergy/sinusitis
 - Allergic fungal sinusitis
 - Establishing an otolaryngic allergy practice
 - Quality improvement ideas/research in otolaryngic allergy
 - The role of the nurse in otolaryngic allergy practice
- 4. Must be double spaced and typed. Submit:
 - Abstract 300 words or less
 - Teaching plan format including target audience, purpose, objectives with content/outline, time frame and teaching methods for each objective (sample will be sent upon request, contact ENT-NF headquarters)
 - Biographical Data form (sample available on request also) or Curriculum Vitae
 - Written copy of presentation for publication in *ORL-Head and Neck Nursing*, the official publication of SOHN, by Congress date the same year.
- 5. Submit to ENT-NF Headquarters by January 31st.
- 5. Submissions for the scholarship will be judged by the President, the Allergy Special Interest Group leader or designee and a member of the ENT-NF Board of Directors appointed by the President. All reviews will be based on the set criteria.
- 6. In the event there are no submissions for this lectureship the National Education Planning Committee will invite a guest lecturer. Selection of the guest lecturer will be dependent on a submitted outline that supports the lectureship's purpose and reflects the criteria.
